72%, or 56 of the 78 students in this program who started in 2007 and scheduled to graduate between 7/07/08 and 5/05/09 went on to graduate; and

*68%, or 38 of the 56 students scheduled to graduate in that year have found jobs in Maintenance, Overhaul, Repair and Manufacturing, encompassing Aerospace, Aviation & Industrial fields.

***11 of the students scheduled to graduate in this period have not responded to our job questionnaire, so we do not know whether they have found jobs or not.**

The figures on the previous page were compiled from our placement records for the students who started in 2007, and displayed according to Office of Education guidelines. The figures show that 38 of 56 students, who successfully completed the course, have been placed. Of the twenty two (22) students not completing the training, three of the students were working in the aviation field; one of the students was working for Worldwide Flight Services; one was working for Jet Aviation; and one withdrew "employed in field".

It should be noted that of the eighteen (18) graduates shown as not being placed, only seven (7) were available for the job market. The other eleven (11) graduates did not receive the F.A.A. certificate and were therefore not qualified for employment as F.A.A. licensed aircraft mechanics/technicians. One (1) of the eleven continued his education at Thomas Edison State College.

To summarize, 38 of 45 available graduates, who started the course in 2007 and scheduled to graduate between 7/07/08 and 5/05/09, were placed in jobs. This translates to an 84% placement rate.
